How to get to the city centre

On 9 November, the LO Meeting will take place in Liège. At the end of the meeting a bus will take all participants to Ghent.

People arriving directly to Ghent:

BY AIR - Brussels National Airport



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Ghent is only 45 minutes from the international airport of Zaventem ' Brussels Airport', where flights arrive from and depart to more than 70 destinations. There are two direct trains per hour between the airport railway station (Brussel-Nationaal-Luchthaven) and the railway station, Ghent-Sint-Pieters (Gent Sint-Pieters station). In the airport, follow the signs to the railway station, which is below ground level. Buy a ticket for Ghent-Sint-Pieters station at the counter in the train station of the airport or online on www.b-rail.be/main/E/

You can board the direct train to Ghent or you can take the shuttle train to Brussels Central Station, which runs every 15 minutes. There, you can change to a train to Ghent-Sint-Pieters.

BY AIR - Charleroi Brussels South Airport

There are 3 options for travelling between Charleroi (Brussels South) Airport and Ghent:

- Option 1

First you need to take a bus to Charleroi Sud railway station. A ticket "billet bulk" can be purchased at the bus stop at the airport. From the Charleroi Sud railway station you can take a train to the Ghent-Sint-Pieters railway station. Train schedules are available under <http://www.b-rail.be/>

- Option 2

There is also a shuttle service running every 30 minutes between Charleroi (Brussels South) Airport and the international railway station, Brussels South (Bruxelles Midi). Shuttle tickets vary between € 5 and € 14 for a single ticket and can be purchased online (<https://www.brussels-city-shuttle.com/en/#/>)

- Option 3

There is a direct bus from Charleroi (Brussels South) to Ghent (station). Prices vary between € 5 and € 15 per trip. More information: <https://www.flibco.com/en#/booking>
